Register the Community Garden Each Year for Rebates

In order to apply for water credits, community gardens should complete the Registration and Renewal form on the reverse side.

To be eligible for the water credit the community garden must:

- Be located within the city limits on lots that are not a single-family use.
- Be open to any Thornton resident who wants to garden.
- Adhere to the city of Thornton community garden ordinance Section 18-195, beehive ordinance starting at Section 6-101, and associated ordinances. City ordinances can be found on the city website: www.ThorntonCO.gov
- Contribute an estimated 20% of the total harvest to area food banks/pantries and report their donations and totals to the city of Thornton Community Connections division at Connections@ThorntonCO.gov.

Eligible community gardens will receive a credit at the end of the season, not to exceed their water usage, on their water bill based on the square footage of the community garden during the summer usage months of April to September. Once Thornton staff have received your Registration and Renewal form and verified that the garden is eligible, staff will forward the application to Utility Billing so that they can process an end-of-season credit on the property water bill. This credit will be applied at the end of the season to comply with the produce donation requirement. Utility Billing can be reached at 303-538-7222. Each property owner is responsible for installing the water line to the community garden on their own.
