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# SHELTERS

## **Family Tree**

Provides emergency shelter and support services for abused women, men, transgender, and non-conforming individuals with or without children. Services for shelter residence include: 24-hour crisis line, food, clothing, case management, on-site health clinic, legal advocacy referrals, parenting support, safety planning, transportation assistance, and referrals to housing. Children under the age of 18 are accepted and if over the age of 18 will need to qualify as their own victim of domestic violence. No fee.

## **Safehouse Denver**

Offers non-residential advocacy based domestic violence counseling to adults, and youth who are victims of domestic abuse and to LGBTQ victims of intimate partner violence. No fee.

## **Gateway Domestic Violence Services**

Provides ways to prevent and eliminate intimate partner violence through counseling, residential care, and empowering people for social change. Gateway has two emergency shelter facilities, one short-term and one long-term shelter, safety planning, court advocacy, nonresidential counseling, and community resources. Pets are welcome.

## **The Crisis Center**

The shelter stay is short term for up to 21 days with provided case management, community referrals, safety planning, and help to meet basic needs such as food and clothing. Group and individual counseling services are also available and include: Coping skills, support group, parenting group, domestic violence education, kids groups, and an advocate will work with you to create a plan that can assist you beyond your stay. (no pets allowed, but can give a referral for shelter for your pet) (3 bags/person)
