Amended Mask Order for All Persons Entering the Court Building for Any Court Business or Proceedings

---

Local and state health authorities now report that positivity rates in both Adams and Weld Counties have dropped below 4%. Therefore, this Court is amending its prior mask orders regarding the public as follows:

Upon entering the Thornton Municipal Court, people can choose whether they want to wear a mask. Wearing a mask in the Courthouse is strongly recommended if:

- You have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID in the last 10 days,
- You are not feeling well and have any symptoms consistent with contracting COVID, or,
- You have medical conditions that put you in a high-risk classification if you contract COVID.


If a person has tested positive for COVID within the last 10 days, they should not enter the Courthouse. They should immediately contact the Court to receive information on how to proceed.

Along with moving to voluntary masking for most people, the Courthouse is moving to voluntary distancing. If individuals want to distance from others while in the Courthouse, they will be able to do so.

This Order is subject to change in response to circumstances of the pandemic.
