Trail Corridors + Loops

TRAIL CORRIDORS	CHARACTERISTICS
BIG DRY CREEK TRAIL	This multi-use regional trail along Big Dry Creek provides opportunities to view wildlife such as coyotes, fox and raptors, and experience a variety of landscapes, while enjoying expansive views of the Front Range. An underpass at I-25 west of Thorncreek Golf Course provides connectivity to the Big Dry Creek Trail in Westminster and further downstream approximately 11.5 miles to Standley Lake Regional Park.
BRANTNER GULCH TRAIL	This trail connects the 107-acre Eastlake #3 Park & Nature Preserve to Northaven Park near Holly Street and will eventually connect further east to Adams County Regional Park.
FARMER'S HIGH LINE CANAL TRAIL	This multi-use trail provides regional connection to Northglenn and Westminster. It is approximately 10.5 miles from the trail at 128th Avenue and Lafayette Street west to Standley Lake Regional Park. At 120th Avenue, the trail connects to the Signal Ditch Trail heading north.
GRANGE HALL CREEK TRAIL	This multi-use trail provides a wonderful east/west corridor through the city linking large parks and open space areas to each other and the South Platte River Trail.
HORIZON TRIBUTARY TRAIL	This trail connects Springvale Park (disc golf course) to Marshall Lake Park and Glen Eagle Open Space. When the corridor is complete, it will connect the northern portion of Thornton to Adams County Regional Park.
LEE LATERAL TRAIL (HERITAGE TRAIL)	This east/west regional trail corridor comes off the Signal Ditch Trail at York Street and provides connectivity to Eastlake #3 Park & Nature Preserve and Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space. The trail serves as part of the Eastlake Heritage Trail Loop.
LAKEVIEW TRIBUTARY TRAIL	This trail corridor connects the Lee Lateral Trail, Eagleview Park and Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space to the Brantner Gulch Trail via Woodbridge Station and Sage Creek Parks.
NIVER CREEK TRAIL	The southernmost Thornton trail corridor connects Pecos Park to the 65-acre Niver Open Space, then connects to Adams County's Niver Canal Trail and approximately 1.25 miles to the South Platte River Trail in unincorporated Adams County.
PLAINS TRIBUTARY TRAIL	This corridor will eventually connect Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space to the Brantner Gulch Trail.
PREBLE CREEK TRAIL	This northernmost trail corridor runs along Preble Creek in the North Creek Farms Subdivision. The trail will eventually connect east to the Big Dry Creek Regional Trail.
SIGNAL DITCH TRAIL	This trail corridor takes off from the Farmer's High Line Canal Trail at 128th Avenue and Lafayette Street northeast towards the city limits. The trail connects Cherrywood Park, Lake Village Park, and Fallbrook Farms Park. The Northern Lights Ball Fields and Eastlake #3 Park & Nature Preserve are accessible from the Signal Ditch Trail through local connector trails. The Signal Ditch Trail also connects into the Lee Lateral regional trail system.
SOUTH PLATTE RIVER TRAIL	This South Platte River corridor, in Adams County, is a significant natural feature that buffers the city of Thornton's eastern boundary. The multi-use regional trail connects the city of Thornton to downtown Denver and Chaffee or Cherry Creek Reservoir.
UNION DITCH TRAIL	This central east/west corridor provides regional connectivity into Northglenn, and connects Woodglenn/Brookshire Park to Skylake Ranch Open Land.
PROPOSED E-470 TRAIL	Regional trail proposed along E-470 would connect Thornton to Broomfield and Commerce City.
LOOPS	CHARACTERISTICS
MARGARET W. CARPENTER PARK & OPEN SPACE LOOPS (Map Loc. - E8)	CARPENTER PARK FIELDS LOOP - 0.8 MILES A popular loop with walkers, runners, and roller-bladers who like to exercise outdoors while enjoying expansive views of the Colorado Front Range.
EASTLAKE #3 PARK & NATURE PRESERVE LOOP (Map Loc. - E6)	OUTER LOOP - 2.0 MILES Departing from the Margaret W. Carpenter Recreation Center, this loop provides walkers and runners the opportunity to go a greater distance on hard and soft surface trails around Thornton's signature park.
HUNTERS GLEN PARK LOOP (Map Loc. - D5)	1.5 MILES A soft-surface loop trail surrounding the reservoir provides an opportunity for Thornton residents to experience open space and wildlife in the middle of the city.
	0.75 MILES This multi-use trail loops around the beautiful Hunters Glen Lake providing opportunities for bird watching and to enjoy views of the Front Range.
