

Concolor Fir
Abies concolor

Height: 30'-50'

The Concolor, or White fir, exists naturally along the western slope in the southern part of the Rockies. It has a dense pyramidal form which it maintains even with age. Fir naturally tolerate a wide range of soil conditions and soil pH values. Best growth occurs on moderately deep, well drained soils. They are sensitive to both excessive soil moisture and air pollution.

Often you will find different varieties of firs used as Christmas trees. They are fragrant and have blunt needles which makes them less 'pokey' than spruce. The needle can be silver-blue to green in color. The Concolor is the best of the firs for adapting to exposure, heat, and drought.
